

ORDINANCE NO. 20-1124

1 AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
2 DOUGLAS, COCHISE COUNTY, ARIZONA, CONFIRMING CERTAIN
3 MODIFICATIONS TITLE 8 OF THE DOUGLAS MUNICIPAL CODE
4 RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY BY AMENDING
5 ORDINANCE 461, 465, 548, 810, 10-977 AND 18-1080 UNDER
6 CHAPTER 8.04 REGULATING ALARM SYSTEMS, ESTABLISHING
7 SEVERABILITY OF COMPONENTS OF ORDINANCE; AND
8 ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

9 WHEREAS, the City of Douglas strives to provide orderly and efficient Alarm System regulations that provide
10 for public safety for events that would require a public safety response in the community; and

11 WHEREAS, the provisions of this Ordinance, insofar as they are substantially the same as ordinance provisions
12 previously adopted by the city relating to the same subject matter, shall be construed as restatements and
13 continuations thereof and are necessary and appropriate to cover operational details for this service to the
14 community; and

15 WHEREAS, although this ordinance does not involve the creation of any new fee or assessment, Article VII,
16 Section 5(3) of the City Charter requires that regulations that have related to fees for City services be dealt with by
17 Ordinance; and

18 NOW, THEREFORE, be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Douglas, Arizona, as
19 follows:

20 SECTION 1. In order to conform local Alarm System regulations to state mandates, under, Title 8, Chapter 8.04,
21 of the Douglas Municipal Code is hereby amended reflecting language additions as shown in colored print, and
22 language deletions shown in strikeout format, as noted on the attached Exhibit "A", incorporated and collaterally
23 functional by reference herein.


24 SECTION 2. All Ordinance and parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.


25 SECTION 3. Effective date: This Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after final approval and adoption
by the Mayor and Council.

SECTION 4. Severability: If any chapter, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for
any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such
decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance and this Ordinance shall continue
in full force and effect after the deletion of the illegal or unconstitutional provision.
